1 MR. ROYCE: Hey, Brian. What's happening, man? 2 MR. GREENWELL: What's happening, man? 3 MR. ROYCE: My name is Detective Royce. Detective And sorry it took me a little while to get over here. 4 5 I was finishing up talking to Jody. 6 MR. GREENWELL: Jody? 7 MR. ROYCE: Mm-hmm. 8 MR. GREENWELL: How's she doing? 9 MR. ROYCE: She's a little upset. 10 MR. GREENWELL: About what? 11 MR. ROYCE: Well, that's what we're to talk about. 12 She's a little upset. I will tell you that she -- I'm trying 13 to remember her exact words, but it was more along the lines 14 of, "I don't want it -- tell him I don't want him to be scared 15 and" -- and to talk to us. Anything else on -- along that 16 'cause I wanted -- "I want to go talk to him." I said, "I 17 can't let you do that." I said, "I may be able to let you do a 18 recorded statement or write a note, but..." 19 MR. GREENWELL: So she do one of them? 20 MR. ROYCE: I have a recording. I also have another 21 recording that I'd like you to view as well. But I -- I can't 22 ask you any questions yet, because you're in custody for 23 something else. I don't know -- I know it's some kind of dope

charge. I know you had some stuff there. So before I actually

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1 ask you anything or tell you or show you anything, I need to 2 read you your rights. You had those read before, correct? 3 MR. GREENWELL: No. MR. ROYCE: You've never had your rights read? 4 5 MR. GREENWELL: No. 6 MR. ROYCE: Okay. Let's go through that. 7 MR. GREENWELL: I mean, when I was younger, yeah. 8 MR. ROYCE: Right, but --9 MR. GREENWELL: But as far as getting them again --10 MR. ROYCE: But you know what I'm talking about? 11 MR. GREENWELL: Yeah, I know what you're talking 12 about. 13 MR. ROYCE: Well, I'm going to go through this 14 because, like I said -- and I brought a picture of your kiddos. 15 MR. GREENWELL: Oh, man. Really? 16 MR. ROYCE: I get -- and I gave her -- I gave her a 17 picture of them too. 18 All right. Before we ask you any questions, you must 19 understand your rights. You got the right to remain silent. 20 Anything you say can and will be used against you in a court of 21 Right to talk to a lawyer prior to any question or making 22 any statements, have him present with you while you're being 23 questioned. Can't afford to hire a lawyer, one will be 24 appointed by the court to represent you before any questioning,

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if you desire one.

You may stop the questioning or make any statements at any time by refusing to answer further or requesting to consult with an attorney prior to continuing with questioning or making any statements. And those are your rights.

And the second part of this -- this form is just -it's a waiver of your rights, and it basically says,

I'm -- "I've read this statement on my rights or I've had them
read to me, and I understand what my rights are; and I'm
willing to make a statement and answer some questions. I don't
want a lawyer at this time, and I understand and know what I'm
doing. No promises or threats have been made to me, and no
pressure and coercion of any kind has been used against me."
You understand what coercion means, right?

MR. GREENWELL: Mm-hmm.

MR. ROYCE: Okay. And I'm guessing you might have an idea of what -- you don't have an idea of what -- what you might want to talk to me about or what I want to talk to you about? Okay. And -- and it has to do with the apartment you guys used to live in over on Shelby Street.

MR. GREENWELL: Oh. Well, yeah. I mean --

MR. ROYCE: I mean, does that ring a bell --

MR. GREENWELL: Yeah.

MR. ROYCE: -- and that incident? Okay. What do you know about that incident?

 $$\operatorname{MR.}$ GREENWELL: Far as I know, they was -- that was supposed to have been us, far as my understanding.

MR. ROYCE: Mm-hmm.

MR. GREENWELL: 'Cause the guy, Terry Payne,
that -- he was supposed to have sent somebody over to talk to
us or something like that, but I don't know 'cause they used to
have deals -- well, I mean, I know the guy too, you know. They
used to have dealings or some -- something like that, and I'm
not even sure if it's him. You know what I'm saying? I'm just
going by what I've heard, that -- he got ripped off for some
dope a few times.

He got upset about it. And the only reason why he wouldn't come confront her by herself, you know what I'm saying, 'cause of me, which she ain't never ripped him off for no dope anyways. It wasn't her. You know, it was --

MR. ROYCE: So this was -- it was geared towards Jody is what you're telling me?

MR. GREENWELL: Yes. And far as I know that somebody was supposed to have sent some people from Chicago, some black dudes. He said, "It's not about the money now. It's not about the dope. It's about the principle." And he, Terry Payne, told me this. And I told him, I said, "Well, you better go back and tell him you're right. It's not about no money. It's not about no principle; but it seems like someone's fucking around with my -- my fiancé. Then it pulls me. You know what

I'm saying? I'm involved." And he said, "Well, it's already too late. The -- the calls have been made and that some people from" -- what'd he say -- New Orleans or something like that. Fucking Louisiana's up here looking for her. And that's when I noticed that -- started being followed. And I'm like, hold up. You know, maybe this shit's true. 'Cause I've been thinking it's all, you know -- you

'Cause I've been thinking it's all, you know -- you know how people get talking just to try to scare somebody. And I kept noticing people following me and I kept noticing people following me; and I'm like, hold the fuck up, hold it, you know. So I made a phone call, and I was like, "Dude, what the fuck is going on?" He said, "Man, I" -- he said, "I told you." He said, "I'll try to go talk to them." I said, "Dude, you better do more than try to go talk to them."

And for the past, I don't know, month and a half, something like that, every time I walked out the door, I was being followed. And for the life of me, nobody believed me. I mean, I told everybody. I said, "Man, somebody is following us. Somebody's following me or somebody's following you, somebody." And then I got locked up.

MR. ROYCE: What happened with that whole little --

MR. GREENWELL: That --

MR. ROYCE: I'm not the dope police

or -- you know, I just --

MR. GREENWELL: I mean, I -- I --

MR. ROYCE: I'm trying to get to the south end, a little tour and --

MR. GREENWELL: Hell, I heard she burned, but -- I mean, not one time did nobody ever say, "Police." Nobody said -- I went the whole time, thinking -- I told everybody I was being followed. I mean, I've had people run up on me, and I'm like -- I'd take off. Nobody ever said, "Cops," you know? So I don't know if it's the cops or if it's them or whoever, whatever. You know what I'm saying? I'm like, shit. So I done what I do -- know to do best, protect myself and get the hell out of that situation for a moment.

But that situation, it was same thing. Few cars whipped up on me. Then once I took off, yeah, he hit his lights. I'm like, you know -- I got a set of them lights, which I do. You know what I'm saying? I got a flashlight that turns -- you know what I'm saying? You click it one time, it sits there and flashes red, white, -- I mean, red, blue and -- them lights. You know what I'm saying?

I'm like, so nobody's ever said, "Stop. Police.

It's the Louisville -- this is the feds, this is the whoever."

You know what I'm saying? So I'm -- I didn't stop, you know?

Even when we got back to the house we were staying at, not one time did anybody say, "Police. This is the police. This is the whoever, blah, blah." They just told me, get the fuck down or they're gonna blow my goddamn brains out.

1 I'm like, well, there's a chance I got to take. 2 Either they're the police -- and then once they all started 3 coming up on me, I noticed it was the police 'cause I seen them with all the equipment and shit like that, you know. And I was 4 5 like, well, maybe this is the cops, so I got down. 6 MR. ROYCE: Who all -- who all did you get arrested 7 with that night? 8 MR. GREENWELL: Me, Jody, Lala, and Chris. 9 MR. ROYCE: Does Lala have a real name? Everybody 10 keeps saying Lala; and I'm like, I don't know who she is. And 11 it -- as I say, I'm not the dope police; but I'm just curious for my own --12 13 MR. GREENWELL: It's Lauren. I know it's Lauren. Ι 14 don't know her last name. 15 MR. ROYCE: And it really doesn't matter for me. I'm 16 just curious. 17 MR. GREENWELL: Yeah. 18 MR. ROYCE: 'Cause everybody says Lala, and I'm like, 19 okay. Last somebody named Lala, it was on -- on a kids' TV 20 show, but -- all right. Let me take you back to that -- that 21 apartment on Shelby. How -- how long had y'all stayed there? 22 MR. GREENWELL: Man, I think --23 MR. ROYCE: I mean, is it --24 MR. GREENWELL: -- I'd just got out of jail, and I

don't know if she's had it before I went in --

1 MR. ROYCE: All right. 2 MR. GREENWELL: -- or before -- right before I got 3 out or what. I think it was only -- I was only there, like, 4 couple weeks maybe. 5 MR. ROYCE: Got you. 6 MR. GREENWELL: Something like that. Maybe a little 7 longer. I know it's, like, between two -- two weeks -- two to 8 three weeks. 9 MR. ROYCE: Okay. 10 MR. GREENWELL: Something like that. 11 MR. ROYCE: And you guys never went back to that 12 apartment? 13 MR. GREENWELL: Yeah, we went back. 14 MR. ROYCE: You did? 15 MR. GREENWELL: Yeah. We went back and got some of our stuff. 16 17 MR. ROYCE: Okay. 18 GREENWELL: I mean, we'd seen the landlord; 19 nothing was ever said. We seen cops sitting there; nothing was 20 ever said to us. I was like, well, this ain't got nothing to 21 do with us, I hope. 22 MR. ROYCE: Did you know those neighbors? Had y'all 23 talked to them? 24 MR. GREENWELL: No.
